



STAGE 5 – TOPIC 3, 4, 8
History – War and Post War Period
POST-ACTIVITIES

After a site study to the Bradman Museum, follow-up and reflective sessions with students are helpful to embed the experience and knowledge shared. Post-visit lessons could include some taxonomic activities (below) and/or extensions of pre-activities.

Remembering	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - List the pros and cons of WWII. - Describe how Sir Donald Bradman served in WWII.
Understanding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write a blog about the first cricket match after the war. - Post a tweet to the Museum commenting on the object you liked the best. - Paraphrase Sir Donald’s career during the wars and post WWII.
Applying	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Google “Australian economics post WWII” and present your findings in a fact sheet. - Translate the facts you have learned into another language. - Using illustrations (your own or from the internet) make a timeline of 10 events found in the Bradman Museum.
Analysing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Analyse and describe the Bradman Gallery in terms of its design – the chronological approach used, and the choice of stories, objects, sound, colours and light. Reflect critically on the choices made in developing the gallery space. - Compare Don Bradman’s career with the career of a contemporary player using a Venn diagram. - Graph the importance of family, sport or politics from 1930 to present. Give reasons for your graph.
Evaluating	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Conduct a debate about the importance of sport during times of hardship (ie the Great Depression, WWI, etc) - In an email critique your experience in the Museum. - Give a speech regarding your definition of utopia. - Choose a significant event from the Bradman Museum and compare how the story was told in the museum to the way the same story is told elsewhere – in a textbook, a novel, a film, or in an online resource.
Creating	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Plan a marketing campaign for the Bradman Gallery. - Record a YouTube clip reflecting on “war on earth” from an inanimate object’s point of view. - Design a web page to explain the contributions of Sir Donald Bradman nationally and internationally.
